- AVC Williams reported on a new two-day interactive training program for managers and supervisors that is coming soon.
- AVC Williams reported that the General Assembly has given all leave-earning SHRA, EHRA and Postdocs (who were actively employed with the State of North Carolina on July 1, 2017 and eligible to earn annual leave) to receive 24 hours of Special Bonus Leave. This leave has been loaded in WolfTime and can now be used. It is retroactive back to July 1, 2017. Those eligible leave earning employees working less than 40 hours per week or less than 12 month appointments have received a pro-rated amount of Special Bonus Leave.

- Changes are effective January 1, 2018
- All Employees will need to take action during the Annual Enrollment period to elect their desired plan and/or lower their monthly premium for 2018.
- \$60 monthly surcharge for those who do not complete tabacco attestation during the Annual Enrollment period
- The CDHP will be eliminated in 2018
